## School Uniform

Please be aware that, from Monday 19th April, Notts County Council will increase the price of school meals to £2.35.

A new 3 week rolling menu will be available shortly and introduced for the Summer term.



Year 5 and 6 children from both schools will be taking part in the DARE programme after Easter. DARE 25 is a 10-week course taught by a DARE officer with a graduation at the end which teaches children how to make the safe and healthy decisions which they will need as they develop into adulthood and beyond.

During the course the children will use a workbook, which they can bring home and share with you. This will include them discussing responsibility, pressure and peer pressure, confident communication, bullying and cyberbullying. The course will also cover risks and consequences, stress and support networks as well as discussing helpful and harmful drugs and alcohol and the effects that these have on the body.
